Appendix 1 – Further information

Introduction

The boom of women's boxing continues internationally and in England. The Amateur Boxing Association of England is committed to developing women's boxing ensuring that women and girls enjoy their boxing experience and therefore stay involved in the sport and to enable those with potential talent to succeed.

The aim of the Women's Box Camp 2009 is to provide an event that supports female boxers of any level to progress to the next level of participation whether that is a recreational boxer who wants to start to compete or a competitive boxer in need of more sparring to help them prepare for competition at a higher level. The Camp will also provide an opportunity for talent identification and development. It will also be an opportunity for women and girls to come together to train, learn, make new friends and train alongside the England Women's Boxing Team in their preparation for the European Championships.

Eligibility

The Camp is open to any affiliated member of the Amateur Boxing Association of England. Affiliated members of Scotland and Wales Amateur Boxing Associations are also welcome but at a cost of £175 for the week. The minimum age for participants is 14 years and the maximum is 34 years.

The Organisers and Providers

The Women's Box Camp is organised by the Amateur Boxing Association of England, administered and co-ordinated by the National Women's Boxing Development Manager and led by the National Coach. The National Coach will be supported by appointed coaches. Female chaperones will be present and particularly support those under the age of 18 years.

Behaviour

The Women's Box Camp is here for you, to help you progress and have fun through the sport of amateur boxing. To ensure the event is a success for everyone the organisers expect the highest standards of behaviour. You will be asked upon arrival to sign a Code of Conduct and to adhere to this throughout the event. Poor behaviour that impacts on others will not be tolerated.

The Programme

The programme will be provided to help everyone progress no matter what their level or experience and FUN is a key component of the week. At this stage we will give you a rough guide as to what will be included, however based on the experience of applicants this will be decided nearer the time and communicated in an information pack sent to all applicants 2 weeks prior to the event.
